One morning in August, Nursing Assistant Crystal Higginson and her husband were volunteering with the Memphis Humane Society, transporting aluminum cans to the recycling plant in downtown Memphis. They approached a chaotic scene of a car accident involving a compact car and large garbage truck. Crystal asked her husband to stop so that she could help because no emergency personnel had made it to the scene yet. She had a first-aid kit in the truck, so she put on her rubber gloves and began assisting a patient who was already on the ground. The patient went in and out of con-

sciousness while Crystal monitored vital signs, helped stabilize her neck and attempted to stop the bleeding caused by extremely severe facial injuries.

Once EMS arrived, Crystal briefed the paramedic on what she had done to help. She then moved on to another victim of the accident that appeared to be suffering from shock. She sat with her until Crystal's husband was able to find a relative that could identify and provide information to EMS, since the victim was unable to respond to questions. Throughout all of the chaos, Crystal maintained her focus and composure, and did not leave the scene until she felt sure that everyone involved in the accident was being cared for. She is a very selfless person with a huge heart who exemplifies the Methodist values, both on and off the job," nominator **Terri Mitchell** said. ## Bozo receives Marye E. Bernard Ally Award



Hispanic Outreach Coordinator Maria Bozo was presented with the Marye E. Bernard Ally Award on Dec. 7 at the Living Out Loud Gala. This award recognizes individuals who are not HIV+ but are critical to the end of the HIV and AIDS epidemic. Upon Maria's immigration to the United States from Venezuela in 2010. Maria noticed a deficiency of services for those suffering from HIV and how the limited availability of HIV related resources impacted her already marginalized

community. Instead of allowing the disease to destroy her community, Maria decided to champion the cause. Despite the hardships that are prevalent in the Latino communities, Maria has continued to successfully advocate for health equity serving as translator, HIV educator, linkage to care coordinator and PrEP navigator.

Maria has continued to work diligently despite many of the recent barriers that have arisen with the influx of immigration task force raids, unearthed government regulations and a growing mistrust of systems and services that are vital to the survival of her community. In her fight to help end the HIV and AIDS epidemic, Maria has relentlessly maintained a less than 30-day linkage rate amongst all of her Latino clients while simultaneously providing them with valuable resources such as translation, assistance with patient navigation through the health care system, and culturally sensitive health literature, all the while steadfastly maintaining patient confidentiality and dignity; thus, fortifying the trust that has been placed in from her community. Because of her ongoing support and tireless work, the Latinx community heralds her as their "Colibri" or noble warrior in the fight against HIV."

"She is truly a trusted gatekeeper not only in the Latinx community but throughout Memphis," Community HIV Network Supervisor **Dana Moore** said.
