

### Power of One: Angela Morelli CV Supervisor helps mom feel at home

In the midst of a busy day in the EKG/ECHO department, a young mother sat anxiously in the waiting area with her child, who was in need of some tests. Though she seemed frightened and overwhelmed, the mother sat quietly at first and waited to be called. Soon, though, she became outwardly upset and began voicing concerns and frustrations to one of the department technicians.

The technician worked to comfort the mother and asked Cardiovascular Services Supervisor Angela Morelli if she could help alleviate the woman's concerns. Angela sat down with the mother and provided a listening ear. The woman explained that she lived two hours away, had no money, no

food, no phone or other means to contact her family and that her 8month-old baby was scheduled to undergo surgery the next day. She was overwhelmed and did not fully understand the course of events for the next 24 hours

Angela patiently sat with the mother and explained everything she needed to know. Then she gave the woman her lunch so she could think on a full stomach and loaned her a cell phone so she could contact her family and keep them informed. Angela also gave the mother some money to have food for the evening and prayed with her along with other members of the Cardiovascular Services team.

You could see that these expressions of compassion eased the mother's concerns," wrote Tammy Swearingen, who nominated Angela for the Power of One. "Angela is a very caring person and consistently shows dedication to our patients and families.

# Le Bonheur implements new patient education program

Le Bonheur Children's has assembled a multidisciplinary team of Associates to evaluate the current patient education program. The Patient Education Task Force, which focuses primarily on illness education, now serves as the approval body for patient education materials from conception to printed piece. Information Resource Specialist Leigh Hays Bernil serves as the contact person for the task force.

The Patient Education Task Force has concentrated on the following priorities: to revise the approval process for the creation and revision of patient education material, to review available printed patient education material, to develop a process for the translation of education material and to investigate the use of available technology for patient education.

A new process for approval and translations of patient education materials has been developed and is available on MOLLI under Education-Patient Education Resources. All patient education material must be approved by the

task force prior to printing. While Le Bonheur currently uses Apple a Day education materials

most frequently, the task force is looking at other commercially available materials that are continually updated. Several companies offer patient education software that updates the information and ensures that the materials contain the newest information.

The task force is also researching ways to incorporate as many multimedia avenues as possible into patient education. The technology package in the new Le Bonheur will provide opportunities for patients to receive education materials and other services through audio/visual means.

"At this point, we want to ensure that any printed materials we have and distribute contain the most accurate information and have both a consistent format and appearance," said Chief Nursing Officer Kathie Krause. "The task force is ready to assist anyone who has a need to develop patient education material.'

# Eubanks, Helms testify in Nashville

Two Le Bonheur experts recently testified in front of the Tennessee General Assembly's public safety subcommittee in support of a bill that would require children to wear helmets at all times while on All Terrain Vehicles. Dr. Trey Eubanks, trauma medical director, and Susan Helms, R.N., M.A.L.S., director of injury prevention and Safe Kids Mid-South, explained that helmets should be essential protection for ATV riders. The bill is sponsored by Rep. GA Hardaway of Shelby County.

Eubanks explained that 90 percent of children treated at Le Bonheur following an ATV accident are under the age of 15 - more than half were younger than 10 years old. In about 85 percent of those cases the children were not wearing a helmet at the time of the accident.

"There is good scientific data to suggest that helmet use does make a difference both with ATV and motorcycle use," Eubanks said

Those wearing helmets had less severe injuries and recovered more quickly than those not wearing helmets. Eubanks shared the story of one of his patients who never regained full function after the ATV he and two other children were riding crashed into a building.

Helms also shared that Tennessee is No. 9 in the country for the number of ATV deaths since 1982. "ATVs are inherently difficult to operate for children under the age of 16 who do not have the cognitive and physical abilities to operate these vehicles safely," she said.

Helms also noted that wearing a helmet, specifically an ATV helmet with a face shield, can reduce the risk of iniury.
